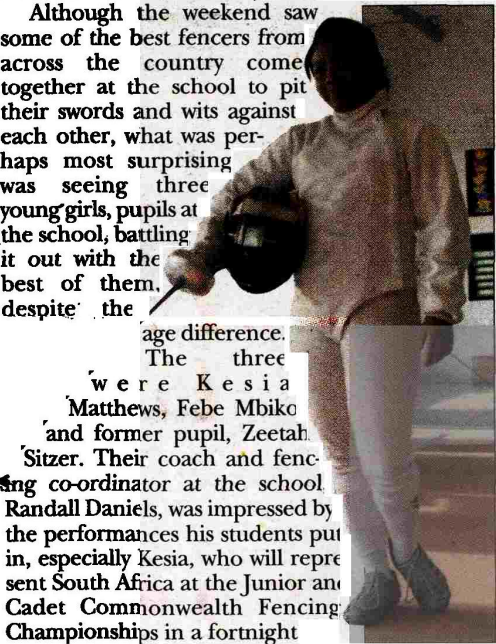
The clang of steel, swishing blades and ripostes could be the type of thing you'd expect to see in a good musketeers movie, not in a school hall...
